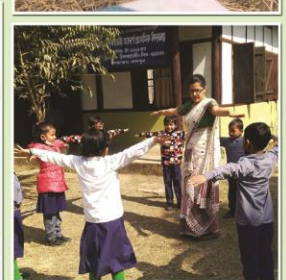
Children will inculcate the knowledge of using mobile, computer, internet
