#### Activities related to Work Education

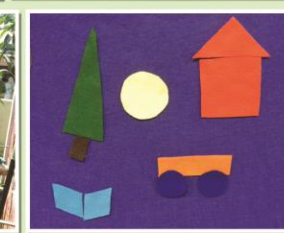
Children will prepare different types of brooms used both in urban and rural lifestyles.
