Several activities related to Work Education, Health and Physical Education and Art Education for classes I to V have been included in the Academic Calendar. The teacher will implement these activities classwise during specific periods allotted in the daily routine.

(The teacher will complete these activities classwise in a graded manner from simple to complex from January to June.)

#### Activities related to Work Education

- **Paper work:** Children will make butterfly, flower, boat, envelope, garland, kite, laddoo, tree, etc.
- **Clay work:** Children will make laddoos, balls, fruits/vegetables (Banana, Apple, Mango, Papaya, Pumpkin, Potato, Ladies' Fingers, etc.)
- **Needle work:** Children will learn hem stitch, run stitch, chain stitch, etc.

#### Activities related to Health and Physical Education

- The teacher will monitor the health and hygiene related activities of the children.
- The children will be made to stand in a row (from tall to short) with their backs straight.
- Children will be made to jump on the spot and follow instructions of Attention and Stand at ease.
- Children will stand in three equal rows and march.
- Children will do light free hand exercises.
- Children will play minor games like frog jump, cat and mouse, handkerchief game, etc.
- Children will jump forward and backward with hands on their waist.
- Children will stand straight and bend forward and backward.
- Children will learn to run 50 metre race.
- Children will do exercise for balancing.
- Arrangements will be made for all to wash hands before and after meals.

#### Activities related to Art Education

- Children will scribble as they wish.
- Children will draw their favourite flowers, fruits, trees, etc.
- Children will develop three dimensional concepts through clay models of flower, fruit, tree, leaf, elephant, cow, goat, etc.
- Children will practise folk songs, prayers and local songs.
- Children will enact scenes based on familiar incidents and events.
- Children will develop concepts of musical instruments like dhol, khol, pepa, flute, etc. and use them in music.
- Children will act individually and in groups by imitating the sounds and behaviour of animals around them.

### Activities and Observation Days of the Month

**January 1:** Trees will be planted by teachers/ students, social workers and NGOs.

- Regular students of previous year will be felicitated classwise along with their guardians.
- Cultural programmes will be held in cooperation with teachers, students, mother group, social persons and school management committee.
- Earthen lamps will be lit in the school campus by these people.

**January 2-6:** Teachers will make Annual educational /administrative/other plans under the guidance of the Headmaster and the School Management Committee.

**17th January:** (1) Shilpi Divas will be observed by offering floral tributes to Rupkonwar Jyotiprasad Agarwala in front of his photograph and lighting of an earthen lamp in the Morning Assembly. A speech on the significance of the day will be conveyed by some selected students.

(2) Shilpi Divas will be celebrated by singing Jyoti Sangeet, recitation of poems and organizing dance programmes, etc.

**26th January:** On the occasion of Republic Day the National Flag will be hoisted by the teachers and students together followed by speeches by teachers and students on the significance of the day. A discussion on the roles and responsibilities of every citizen towards the Constitution of India will be held.

**30th January:** Schools will conduct "Fire Safety Drill" involving Fire & Emergency Services Department & District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA).

Several activities related to Work Education, Health and Physical Education and Art Education for classes VI to VIII have been included in the Academic Calendar. The teacher will implement these activities classwise during specific periods allotted in the daily routine.

(The teacher will complete these activities classwise in a graded manner from simple to complex from January to June.)

#### Activities related to Work Education

- **Paper work:** Children will make flowers, hand fans, geometrical shapes like triangle, square, rectangle, cube and kite, collage, etc.
- **Clay work:** Children will make different clay models of fruits, vegetables, animals, dolls and earthen lamps, etc.
- **Bamboo work:** Hand fans, sieves, ruler, fencing, etc. will be made.
- **Needle work:** Children will learn to make handkerchiefs, button holes, table cloth, bags, *sorai* cover, etc.

#### Activities related to Health and Physical Education

- The teacher will monitor the health and hygiene related activities of the children.
- Children will perform free hand exercises.
- Children will learn to run 100 metre race.
- Children will do a march-past.
- Children will do exercises for body balancing.
- Children will learn the *pranayam*(Yoga).
- Children will play football, *kho-kho*, long jump, high jump, kabaddi, etc.
- Children will learn to walk with correct posture.
- Children will play Passing the Ball game.
- Children will play local games.
- Arrangements will be made for all to wash hands before and after meals.

#### Activities related to Art Education

- Children will draw pictures of day to day life.
- Children will make collage with coloured papers.
- Children will make coloured prints from cut pieces of potato, onion, ladies' fingers, etc.
- Children will enact scenes based on the environment.
- Children will make posters based on RTE Act, conservation of environment and child abuse, etc. and colour them.
- Children will write and perform street plays based on value education.
- Children will prepare projects/models on various familiar objects.
